Thanks to a transformational \$1 million gift from Dale and Lois Keyes, we are thrilled to announce the arrival of a brand-new CT scanner in the Diagnostic Imaging Department!

On June 19th, we celebrated this milestone with a ribboncutting ceremony – just days after the scanner was installed and put into use.



This state-of-the-art technology will significantly enhance our diagnostic capabilities and elevate patient care in our community—an achievement made possible by the compassion and commitment of supporters like you.

More Essential Care, Close to Home

Thanks to the incredible response to our recent donor appeal, we were able to purchase a brand-new **operating room table** at a cost of \$51,417. This essential upgrade replaces a broken table and ensures that surgeries can continue without delay—keeping patients safe and care on schedule. Your generosity made this possible, and we're so grateful for your continued support.







We're proud to share another milestone in expanding access to care right here in our community. Thanks to the generous supporters of the WDMH Cancer Care Fund, the hospital has acquired specialized equipment to perform breast biopsies—a \$152,112.54 investment that's already making a

difference, with four biopsies taking place in the first couple of weeks. This new capability means shorter regional wait times and a more streamlined diagnostic journey for patients. From initial screening and follow-up to biopsy and surgery, it can now all happen at WDMH—bringing compassionate, comprehensive cancer care closer to home.

Other purchases made possible by you:



Simulator Accessories for the WDMH Chemo Department, were purchased at a cost of \$551, allowing the simulator to be used once again. This tool is used to teach patients about their central ports and supports informed decision-making about their care. Having this tool available here at

WDMH, allows the oncology team to provide essential teaching here – eliminating the need for patients to travel to Ottawa.



In Cardiac Care, we've invested \$10,189 in **specialized software for our Holter monitors**. This advanced technology detects irregular heartbeats and enables staff to analyze reports with

greater precision—leading to faster, more accurate diagnoses and improved patient outcomes.

The funds were raised during their annual Fun Days event where soccer players, their families, and friends came together to enjoy a day of games, food, and fun. Attendees purchased hot dogs, pizza, and other treats, with 100% of the proceeds supporting the donation.





After spending over a year growing mullets, two amazing young men led a group

of friends in a unique fundraiser to raise funds and awareness for cancer. Called the Mullet Mas-a-Cure, the head-shaving event was in honour of their friend Derek Ireton. Cole DeVries and Hunter Wilson, along with their friends Easton DeVries, Jack Holmes, Mason Wilson, Isaac Frampton, and Kane Cooper, raised an incredible \$6,970, with \$3,000 coming to the WDMH Cancer Care Fund.

Shroomfest, a popular men's fundraising event, has made a powerful impact on local healthcare with a donation of \$6,000 towards the WDMH General Equipment Fund to help purchase a new LP 15 Defibrillator for the Family Birthing Unit.

Staff and volunteers from the Foundation and Dundas Manor spent some time at both Winchester Tim Hortons locations to decorate many Smile Cookies once again. At the end of a very busy week, an incredible \$11,607.63 was donated. Funds this year supported the purchase of a mobile hygiene chair for the new home.



The community indulged in sweet treats for a great cause at the second annual King's Day Bake Sale Fundraiser by **Bitty Birds Bakery** in support of the new Dundas Manor. The sale was held at **Loughlin's Country Store** in Hallville, and store owner Stephanie Redmond stepped in to match the bake sale proceeds. Together with donations, a total of \$844.75 was raised.

The Independent Order of Odd Fellows (IOOF) Lodge #428 provided a generous donation of \$10,000 to support the redevelopment of the new Dundas Manor, reinforcing its long-standing commitment to community service and charitable giving, and helping us move closer to having a modern, welcoming space for long-term care in our region.



Thanks to the generosity of the North Dundas Masonic Lodge #320, fundraising for the new Dundas Manor is \$13,300 closer to the \$18 million needed to build and furnish the home! This busy group of men raised \$10,000 through local support of their events. They then applied to The Masonic Foundation of Ontario and received a top-up grant of \$3,300 to add to their donation.



Dundas Manor Redevelopment

When our campaign to build a new Dundas Manor Long-Term Care home was launched in March 2020, the goal to reach \$18 million seemed like a dream. Together, with the support of donors like you, the dream is coming true!

With only \$3.5 million more to go, the Foundation team continues to work hard to connect with people who care about this community to share the magic of the new home.

The construction team is also working hard – and they are currently on time and on budget – and great news...we are **now officially over 50% complete!**

The new Dundas Manor will be more than double the size of the current home. Thirty additional residents will be welcomed, for a total of 128 residents.

There will be four resident home areas called Homesteads. Each one will have a wonderful gathering space as well as beautiful outdoor gardens nearby. Hallway dining will be a thing of the past as there will be four large, bright dining rooms with enough space for everyone. Rooms in the new home will be larger – and everyone will have a window.

By the end of this summer, the following items will be complete:

- The North wings (by Clarence Street) will be fireproof.
- All exterior walls will be in place, with windows being installed.
- Siding will be installed on the South wings (by Fred Street), and the brick work will begin.
- Roofing will be complete, for a 100% waterproof building.
- Painting and ceiling work will be underway.
- Ductwork, mechanical rough-ins, electrical work, drywall, etc., are ongoing.

Things are currently on track for a grand opening next fall – but we still need your help to spread the word and raise awareness and funds. Remember our lawn signs from last year? We still have some available for anyone who would like to have one in their yard! Reach out to any of the Foundation team for more information or pick one up at our office.







